Dear New Resident(s)

I am presently the Chair of Ufford Parish Council, and on behalf of the Council I would like to welcome you to the village of Ufford. We believe you have made an excellent choice in deciding to live here. You will find that Ufford is a friendly and very active village, and if life changes necessitate a move away from Ufford it is usually with great regret, and many people continue to be 'honorary' residents!

Ufford has an active community, and while there is no longer a school or a shop, there is plenty to do. There are two excellent pubs in the village; the Community Hall is the venue for several clubs and activities. At the Recreation Ground there is a Children's Play Area, a Tennis Court, and table tennis, along with a Boules Terrain. The Parish Council owns the Parklands Wood which lies behind the Recreation Ground, and a group of volunteers meet to work and care for the woods to the benefit of all of us. The beautiful and historic Parish Church of St Mary of the Assumption is in the old heart of the village, with the Church Hall just across the lane. Several parochial and social events are held there, including amateur dramatics and the Ufford Summer Show organised by the Gardening Club. There are many footpaths in Ufford, some leading to neighbouring villages, and maps are available.

The Parish Council holds monthly meetings (on the third Tuesday) and any resident is very welcome to attend. The agenda is always posted on the Parish Council website 5 days in advance, and this gives details of the location of the meeting, and items to be discussed. The minutes of previous meetings are also available to read on our website. The Parish Council has some statutory duties, and has a role in the general maintenance of the village, but our real aim is to enable Ufford to continue to be the wonderful village we all love, and to respond to any ideas to further improve it.

There is a lot more detailed information on the pages of the website, so please do take the plunge and join in some of the things going on in the village and meet your new neighbours – if not all 950, then at least some of them!
